Master's Program in Circumpolar Health and Wellbeing

- Is a multidisciplinary two-year program (120 ECTS/60NA credits including theses) approaching circumpolar health and wellbeing as a holistic phenomenon
- Focus is to provide the graduates with knowledge and skills in the field of health care and wellbeing in Northern environment
- Studies contain an exchange period at one of the partner universities
- Program is open to students with Bachelor's Degree in health or social sciences (or equivalent)



Core topics of MCH

- Specific character of living in a northern environment/ circumpolar conditions
- Special characters of health, wellbeing, socio-economic and cultural transitions, and experiences of health, illness and wellbeing of northern residents and northern cultures
- Special needs of people living in the circumpolar region; promotion, prevention, care and rehabilitation, health care systems / services
- Connection between the northern environment and human health and wellbeing



Curriculum outline (120 ECTS/60 NA credits)

1. Circumpolar Health & Wellbeing Package 40 ECTS (compulsory)

- On-line courses in Circumpolar Health & Wellbeing
- Introduction and Orientation to Master's program
- Seminars I and II

2. Theoretical studies 15-20 ECTS (selective courses, on-site and/or on-line)

- Courses in Philosophy of Science (quantitative, qualitative)
- Research Methodology
- Research Ethics



3. Applied studies 5-45 ECTS (elective courses, on-site and/or on-line)

- Profession-specific studies in Promotion / Prevention/ Care / Rehabilitation
- Courses in Project Methodology

4. Field placement 10-15 ECTS (optional)

5. Thesis and thesis seminars 20-40 ECTS (compulsory)

Compulsory exchange period

First intake in spring 2008 > pilot delivery starts in fall 2008
