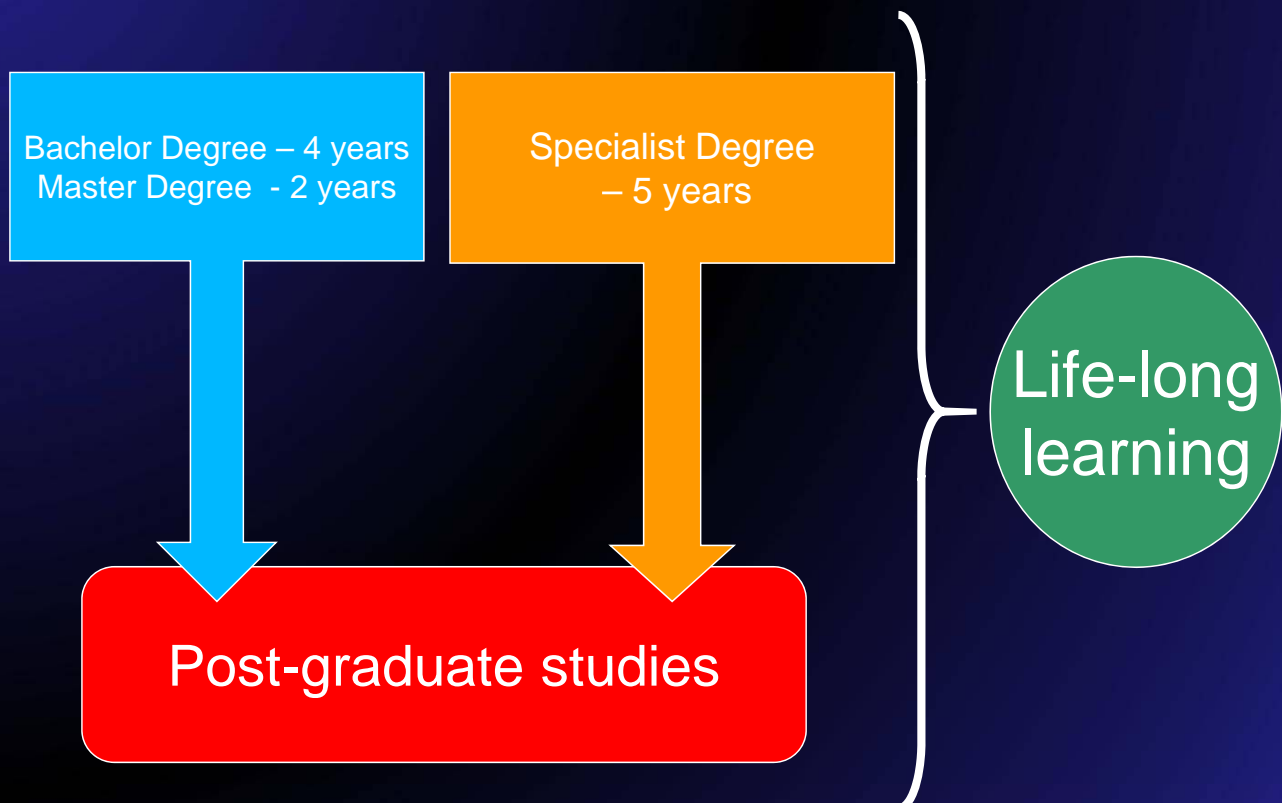


MSHU today

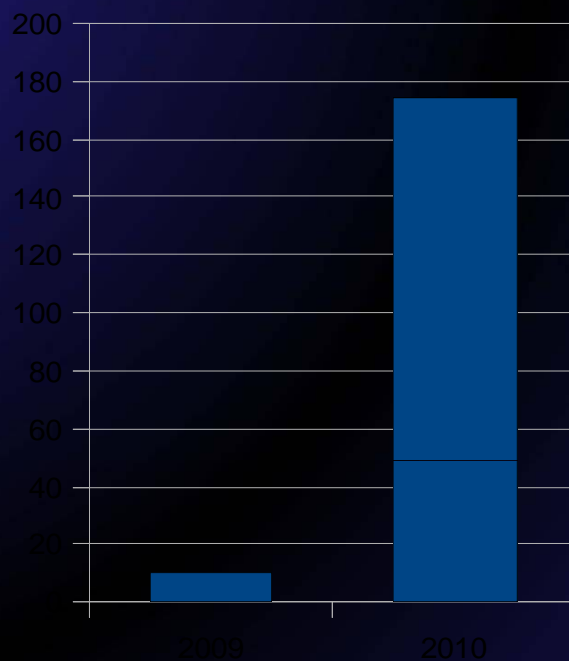
