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Challenges

Student intake
The number of students admitted to the programmes should be big enough;

to ensure efficiency of the programme and sufficient number of graduates

To find sufficient number of motivated students for the programmes;

To keep students studying actively in the 2-year programme;
To have students for the programme from all BCBU partner universities.

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Challenges

- Development of virtual campus
 - Necessary for effective collaboration
 - What are the present facilities and resources of universities for virtual teaching?
 - How to build up the virtual campus?
 - Funding?
 - Practical issues?

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Funding and Resources

- Importance of the funding programmes – Kolarctic ENPI, Tempus, other EU-funding
- Resources from the universities are needed for carrying out the studies
 - Staff resources
 - Premises and equipment
 - Students' travel costs

- Next call for application in CSW (opens at Ulapland in December 2010)
- Development of virtual campus
- Strenghtening the role of associate partner universities
- Quality assurance handbook
 - Consolidation of study recuirements, master theses, grades
- Development of PhD studies together with Russian, Finnish, Swedish and Norwegian universities
- University of Arctic (UArctic) collaboration
