


Foreign students at NSMU


International School of Public Health in Arkhangelsk



Master Programme in Public Health¹



- Provided since: January 2007
- Funding: Barents Health Programme
- First graduates: December 2008
- Duration of studies: 2-4 years
- Number of students: up to 30 per year
- Language of instruction: English
- Tuition fee: no



Curriculum

- 7 Compulsory modules (60 ECTS)
- 13 Elective modules (30 ECTS)
- Master Thesis (30 ECTS)

Teachers

- every module is leaded by an experienced teacher from partner universities of northern Europe (2-5 teachers per module)
- 29 foreign teachers
- 15 employees of the NSMU who have got training according to similar programmes abroad are involved in teaching
- programme of training of ISPHA future teachers (training-the-trainers programme)

The Arkhangelsk International School of Public Health is establishing a new type of public health education in the Russian Federation.

"Public health, as it is seen and perceived abroad, is not well developed in the Russian Federation," says project coordinator Alexander Kudryavtsev. "So our programme is one of the first attempts in the Russian Federation to establish public health education in accordance with international standards."

The school was founded in September 2006 at the country's Northern State Medical University with support from the Department of Health Care of the Administration of Arkhangelsk Region in collaboration with several north European universities, Kudryavtsev says. The school is partly funded by the Barents Euro-Arctic Council (BEAC), a forum for intergovernmen-

tal cooperation in the Barents Region, and it admitted its first students in January 2007.


Currently, 24 students are enrolled on MPH programme and a further 29 will be admitted in January 2008. They come from diverse backgrounds and include medical doctors, social workers, psychologists, university teachers and health administrators.

A school was needed for many

reasons. Kudryavtsev says public health has deteriorated since the 1991 collapse of the Soviet Union, with life expectancy, infant mortality, cardiovascular and infectious diseases, alcoholism, accident rates and drug abuse going "from bad to worse in all instances".

Kudryavtsev says: "There's a need for new quality of specialists trained to deal with public health, and we are training such specialists".


